

## Ocular Melanoma (OM)

**OM** is rare, affecting approximately five in a million people; about 200 cases are diagnosed per year in Canada. Like other melanomas. it begins in melanocytes - the cells that produce the pigment melanin. Also referred to as uveal melanoma. 90% of primary OM develops in the choroid

**Uveal Melanoma** - The uvea is a three-layered part of the eye. It is made up of the choroid, iris and ciliary body. Uyeal melanoma can form in any of these layers and is named for where it forms:

- Choroidal melanoma
- Iris melanoma
- · Ciliary melanoma
- Coniunctival Melanoma
