Government Relations and Advocacy

SYSF continues to expand signatories of the Declaration of Personal Health Data Rights in Canada

Developed by a patient and caregiver-led Data Working Group formed from SYSF's annual Patients Redefining the Future of Healthcare in Canada Summit, the Declaration of Personal Health Data Rights in Canada is intended to create greater consensus on the fundamental principles associated with personal health data, particularly from the perspective of patient and citizen groups; in order to encourage the health ecosystem to work out how to achieve these principles efficiently and effectively in partnership with industry, policy-makers, other data custodians, and patients.

In 2022, SYSF has advocated for the implementation of a Pan-Canadian Health Data Strategy, including 3 OpEds and letters sent to all F/P/T Ministers of Health, P/T Premiers and the Prime Minister from patient groups regarding the need for cooperation to develop and implement a national data management strategy across Canada.



40 municipalities8 provinces

In 2022, thanks to our outreach efforts 40 municipalities in 8 provinces across Canada issued signed Proclamations to proclaim the month of May 2021 'Melanoma and Skin Cancer Awareness Month'.
